



E1E Go-Live at Community Hospitals this Weekend

Epic1 downtime procedures available

The big event is almost here – the **September 24, 2022 Epic1 Enterprise (E1E) Go-Live at all Community hospitals**, which includes Epic’s Hospital Billing, Grand Central, Prelude, and Clinical Case Management applications. Specifically, the Soarian revenue cycle system is being replaced with Epic Hospital Billing at Barnes-Jewish St. Peters Hospital, Progress West Hospital, Christian Hospital/Northwest HealthCare, Alton Memorial Hospital, Parkland Health Center and Missouri Baptist Medical Center Sullivan Hospital, and Revenue Cycle Management. Epic applications will also replace Allscripts CarePort for Utilization Review, and Teletracking for Bed Planning.


To get there, the following processes will take place in the early hours of **Saturday, Sept. 24:**

- **Midnight (12 a.m.):** The BJC’s current Epic1 system becomes “Read Only” for AMH, BJSPH, CH/NWHC, MBSH, PHC and PWH. This is also known as “downtime.”
- **At approximately 6 a.m.:** Epic1 becomes available to all end users at AMH, BJSPH, CH/NWHC, MBSH, PHC and PWH - and the new Epic1 system is live!
